GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR TALENT EVENTS:

1. Art, Music, Song-Leading, Bible Memory, Preaching, and Girl's Reading/Storytelling/Sunday School lesson entries must sign up for respective events upon arrival on Monday! **(Paper for art must be picked up from Bro. Bingham before the evening service Monday evening.)**
2. Bible Memory entries must register and qualify before 4PM Monday.
3. All Music events will be limited to a 3 (three) minute time limit. A 5 (five) point penalty will be added to your final score for each additional 15 seconds.
4. Preaching and Girls Reading/Storytelling have time limits. A 5 (five) point penalty will be added to your final score for each additional 15 seconds. **All outlines must be approved by Pastor and/or Youth Director.**
5. All art entries must be a black and white freehand sketch using a graphite pencil only.
No art entry may be started before arrival at camp grounds. All Art entries must be completed and turned in by 12pm Thursday of camp. Judging will be done @ 1pm
6. Boys' Song Leading contestants will lead the congregation in a hymn or Jr Church-type song. If a contestant chooses a chorus for his entry, it may be sung twice. If a hymn is chosen, he may lead 1 (one) verse and 1 (one) chorus.

GENERAL RULES FOR BIBLE QUIZ

1. The quiz will be a written test administered at 7:45AM Wednesday.
2. You may participate as an individual and/or on a 4 (four) member team.
3. There is no limit on the number of teams a church may enter. However, a contestant may be a member of only one (1) team.
4. There will be awards for team and individual members.

ATTENTION!

Sports activities may begin at 2:15 PM on Monday, so teams need to be ready to participate at that time. Schedules will be posted!

BASKETBALL (boys only)

1. Mo. State High School Activities Assoc. rules apply except where noted or advised by the officials.
 2. Games will consist of 2 ten minute halves
 3. Each team will be allowed 2 full time outs per half. The clock will remain running with the exception of free throws and time outs.
 4. The running clock will cease during the last minute of the game (the clock shall be stopped as in regular play by the officials) unless there is a 20 point differential.
- JUNIOR CAMP:* No full court press allowed. The player with the ball must be allowed to cross half court.

KICKBALL

(JUNIOR CAMP: Three-Pitch Kickball)

1. Teams will consist of 10 players
2. Games will consist of five innings
3. Each player kicks a ball each inning
4. Coach shall pitch to their own team. Coaches shall not interfere with the ball. Each batter shall receive 3 (three) pitches.
5. If the batter does not kick the ball in 3 (three) pitches they are called out.
6. Rules 5 through 15 from Senior Camp apply to Junior Camp.

SOFTBALL

(SENIOR CAMP: One-Pitch Softball, Boys & Girls)

1. Teams will consist of 10 players.
2. Each game will consist of three innings.
3. Each teams coach will pitch. (Defensive pitcher can stand by the mound but cannot interfere with the pitch. The offensive pitcher cannot make contact with the ball while it is in play.)
4. Each batter gets one pitch. Regardless if you swing or not, if the ball is not hit that batter is out.
5. There will be “outs” as in regular softball, however each player will take a turn at bat each inning.
6. At the end of each out, the umpire begins counting to (5) five.
7. The pitcher will have 5 (five) seconds to pitch the ball to their teammate (There will be several softballs by the pitchers mound.)
8. The last batter must yell “Last Batter.” (The umpire must hear it and will relay it to the defense. It will be an automatic out if the last batter does not announce he is the last batter.)

9. The last batter must try to score a run.
10. The last batter can be forced out at any base ahead of the runner to end the inning.
11. There is 30 seconds between each inning.
12. After the last batter scores or is forced out, the umpire will begin counting. The first 20 seconds will be silent, the last 10 audible.
13. The pitcher must pitch the ball before the umpire counts to 10.
14. It is an automatic out if the pitcher does not pitch within the time limit.
15. The team with the most runs wins the game.

Appeal Process: Follow these procedures to appeal a particular play:

Ball must be returned to the pitcher.

Pitcher must return to the mound.

Pitcher steps off the mound and calls the umpire's attention to the appeal

Umpire's decision is final.

WATER BASKETBALL (boys only)

1. 10 minute game with (2) 5 minute halves.
2. At the half, the teams will switch directions.
3. 5 players are allowed in the pool for each team.
4. Each basket is worth 1 point.
5. No hitting or grabbing around the neck. No touching any player who does not have the ball. Any of these violations results in ejection from the game for one minute and the violator's team must play with 4 or fewer players until time is up.
6. If the same player is ejected 2 times, that player is not allowed to re-enter the game.
7. The violating team may replace that player after one minute.
8. Substitutes may freely enter the game when the player he is replacing is out of the pool.
9. No time out shall be called except by the referee or in case of injury.

VOLLEYBALL (Both Camps)

1. A match shall consist of 2 out of 3 games won.
2. Games shall consist of 15 points each.
3. A team must win a game by at least 2 points.
4. A team must play with 6 players unless an injury shall make their 6th player unable to participate.
5. If a third game is necessary, the team that did not call the toss to start the match will call the third game toss
6. Rally scoring shall in be effect for all games. Rally scoring is when every serve results in a point. The serve goes to the team awarded the point.
7. There is no blocking or spiking of a serve. No underhand lifts, or overhead carries are allowed. This is called at the discretion of the Net Judge.
8. Players may not touch the net. A "spike" may reach over the net so long as there is no contact with the net initiated by the person spiking the ball.
9. Players shall wait for the official's whistle before each serve. Each team will be allowed one warning for this violation per game (up to 3 warnings per match, per team). After that, it will be a point for the opposing team, and the ball will change possession.

10. Substitutions will be restricted to the center back position only, unless there is an injury. Substitutions are completely at the discretion of the coach. Any player may be substituted for any other player, but it must happen in the back center position AFTER the service position.
11. Power (overhand) serves are allowed.

JUNIOR CAMP ONLY: The serving line may be moved forward 6 feet from the back court out of bound line. The same applies for the entire team. There are no power (overhand) serves allowed from this easier front serving line.

WATER VOLLEYBALL (girls only)

1. 10 minute game with (2) 5 minute halves.
2. At the half, teams will switch sides.
3. The ball is “out” of play if it hits the walls of the pool.
4. The ball is considered “in” if it hits the back court ropes.
5. 6 players are allowed in the pool for each team.
6. Players may rotate in and out of the game in the center back position only unless there is an injury.
7. No time outs shall be called except by the referee or in case of an injury.
8. The referee shall call the score before each serve.
9. The server must wait for the whistle to be blown before each serve.
10. The player in the serving position may move forward at the discretion of the referee.
11. At the half, the team in possession of the ball and the server who was serving will continue to serve after the side change has been made.
12. NO STALLING: Stalling shall be called at the official’s discretion and will result in the loss of the ball.

COACHES AND PASTORS:

- NO arguments. No coach or Pastor is allowed on the playing surface to dispute a call. This excludes the “Appeal” process described for One Pitch Softball at Sr. Camp.
- Official’s calls are final.
- Please maintain a Christian attitude that will let the young people play the game.
- The officials will do their best to see that the young people have a good time. Please come with the same attitude.
- All campers from any church who desire to participate in the team events will be assigned to a team.
- All teams sports registration forms are due when the church registers.
- Participants for the individual events will sign up at the time of the event.
- Canoes will be available on the pond and may be used only during recreation times.
- All activities are only possible as we have volunteers to help. PLEASE come to camp prepared and looking for places to help!

CAMP RULES

SAFETY AND HEALTH

1. Stay off cliff. Stay in lighted areas at all times. Don't run down hill.
2. Don't throw rocks. Don't throw anything in lake or pools.
3. Water safety: Never enter pool areas except for scheduled swimming periods when lifeguard is on duty. Obey all pool rules. Obey all lifeguards and adult supervisors. Use life vests in canoes. (STAY OUT OF PONDS)
4. Eat meals & drink water. Snack foods and hot weather make for sick campers.

SPIRIT AND UNITY

1. All campers must participate in all services. Nicer clothes are encouraged for evening services.
2. Water pistols/balloons, fireworks, radios, audio/video players/games, laser pointers, cell phones, and any other electronic devices are not allowed.
3. Campers or Counselors must never leave grounds without permission from their Head Counselor and the Camp Chairman, and the Head of Security must be notified.
4. Obey the dress code: (Counselors and Campers)
Girls: sport skirts, culottes, dresses are to be sitting knee-length. No bare midriff, no cleavage, and no spaghetti straps. No slacks, capris or cutoffs. (Inappropriate messages on hats or clothing is prohibited)
Boys: Wear modest fitting sweats, jeans, slacks, or shorts. **Modest shorts must cover the knees at all times.** No muscle shirts, pajama pants, mesh shirts, gang colors. (Inappropriate messages on hats or clothing is prohibited)
5. No weapons of any kind (including pocket knives). No tobacco products or vaping devices of any kind.
6. All attendees agree to act in accord with the camp's statement of faith. (found on camp website)
 - Campers may be sent home at the discretion of the Camp Chairman, their own Pastor, or Head Counselor for violation of these rules or the spirit/unity of the camp.
 - Campers need to change into their swimming attire at the pool.

GUIDELINES FOR BIBLE MEMORY

Ps 119:11 plainly declares “Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee.” Memorizing God’s Word will enable campers to resist and escape temptation.

The goals of this event are simple:

1. To be able to lead someone else to Christ (guidelines 1 and 2);
2. To comprehend entire thoughts or ideas from God’s Word (guidelines 5 and 6);
3. To hide as much of God’s Word in the camper’s heart as possible.

So that “*all things be done decently and in order*” (1 Cor. 14:40), we have established the following guidelines:

1. In order for a camper to qualify as a Bible Memory contestant, the “Romans Road” plan of salvation must be quoted word-perfect in the following order:

Romans 3:10, 23; 6:23; 5:8; 10:9,10,13. Verses must be quoted to the Camp Talent Coordinators.

2. All potential contestants must register and qualify with the Camp Talent Coordinators before 4PM, on the Monday of camp.
3. Guidelines 1 and 2 are prerequisite to be eligible to be a contestant.
4. Each contestant must have two (2) reference lists: one for the camper and the other for the Listener. A contestant may add to these lists as needed.
5. Each contestant must begin by quoting passages consisting of a minimum of 5 verses. There must be a minimum of 25 verses quoted during this portion of the competition. This can be done many ways, such as 5 sets of five, one passage of 25, etc.
6. These passages must be quoted perfectly, as a whole, with at least one passage being attempted in a sitting. If a passage of 5 verses is attempted, and 1 word in a single verse is missed, then the whole passage must be requoted.
7. Guidelines 5 and 6 are prerequisite to all other verses being quoted (individual or further passages).
8. When a contestant has qualified and met the prerequisites, individual verses and/or passages may be quoted. Individual verses are as the name implies, individual. A sequential order or a complete thought is not required. NOTE: See guideline #9.
9. A minimum of five (5) verses, individual or passage, must be attempted at one time. Contestant receives credit for any or all of the verses quoted in accordance to the guidelines. (This rule is intended to protect the limited time of each Listener) If the contestant comes down to the last few verses, and these verses total fewer than 5 it is acceptable to quote these even though they don’t meet the minimum requirement for a sitting. A contestant MAY NOT study and quote one verse at a time during that sitting. The contestant may pause to study again every 5 verses if necessary.
10. No repetitive verse or verses will be allowed.
11. Each qualified contestant will be assigned a Listener to whom the verses will be quoted.
12. Verses may be quoted to the camper’s assigned Listener until Thursday of camp at 4PM.
13. All verses, individual or passage, must be from the KJV Bible only.
14. To be counted, the verse must be quoted “word-perfect” without help from the judge or any outside source.
15. Should any questions arise or clarifications be necessary, the Talent Coordinator shall be responsible to settle the issue. The decision of the Talent Coordinator shall be final.
